GDPR: Top UK law firms falling victim to human error

‘Nearly half (48%) of the top 150 law firms have reported data breaches since the GDPR came into force in May 2018. And, of those breaches, 41% were a result of emailing the wrong person.’ *Legal Futures 24 January 2020*

GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018 have now been in place for almost two years. When introduced we had not seen new legislation for data protection for almost 20 years. This meant a lot of changes had to be made in the way we work with our IT systems and paper files. Data subjects were given more rights around their data and the way we use it.

Now, almost two years on, it’s maybe time to have a refresh of what was put in place to ensure we are still compliant.
