# TRS: GETTING TO GRIPS WITH THE DIFFICULT ISSUES AHEAD OF THE 1<sup>ST</sup> SEPTEMBER 2022 DEADLINE

With less than 6 months to register existing express trusts, many questions remain about the scope of TRS. The rules can seem random or unfair, so getting to grips with them is challenging, and the latest updates of HMRC's TRS Manual are vital.

John Bunker, a regular speaker to our Society and one of the TRS Sub-group advising HMRC on the guidance in their new TRS Manual, is delivering a <u>live webinar for us from 2pm – 4pm on</u> <u>Wednesday, 4<sup>th</sup> May</u> where he aims to make sense of all this including understanding which express trusts and joint ownerships are excluded, or must register, how it works and the latest HMRC guidance. The webinar is aimed at all practitioners who do any form of private client work, with property, wills, estates, tax and trust planning or compliance; and anyone with responsibility for complying with anti-money laundering regulations, as these 5 MLD provisions have a largely AML purpose.

SSCS, RPT and IAC Tribunals in the Southeast and the HMCTS Video Hearings service - The Video Hearings service is starting to be used and from 14 March 2022 some hearings will move across to the service. If a hearing you are involved with is affected, it's important that you are ready. If you've not taken action already, please follow the guidance <u>here</u> and check with your IT support that the firewall settings on your network will not block access as this can happen as it is a web based service.

#### **REGULATORY MATTERS**

Tediously bewildering but necessary. As current topics become increasingly relevant, so they generate controversy. If only to become better informed or to contribute views and any experiences in Consultations or pure dialogue, and unless already done so, one very useful pathway might be to <u>subscribe to the now digital "Gazette"</u> and register as a commentator on its leading articles. This can be done anonymously (invariably the most explicit and stimulating contributions!). At the moment there is no shortage of constructive debate amongst what is, after all, such a very diverse profession as our own. A perfect example is the ongoing response to the SRA's planned closure of SIF...different interest groups, proportionality of cost to benefit, the destiny of those funds and potential replacement levies. There is also now a mere six weeks or so left to respond to the SRA proposal to absorb and thereby prosecute a broader range of disciplinary matters and to raise its fining threshold to £25,000. Illuminating but more frenzied are the exchanges regarding the future of LeO now that its Rules are having to be re-addressed after an unhappy ten years. The serious backlog of cases which has accumulated is causing a reputational crisis. Last but by no means least the networking amongst diligent Compliance Officers as they face the increasingly sophisticated and opportunist money launderer and fraudster. Well worth checking out.

## HOW TO TRACE PAST SOLICITORS AND LAW FIRMS

Did you know that the Law Society Library can help if you need to trace old solicitors and find out what happened to law firms? For example, you might need help if a family member wrote their will decades ago using a local solicitor, but all trace of them has now gone. This guide covers the resources held by the library and other organisations that can help. The library also offer a research service which is free for members (at least the first 30 minutes and after that it is £20 + VAT per 30 minutes - they said most firms found within an hour). For non-members the cost is £20 plus VAT per 30 minutes.
