CONTENTIOUS PROBATE / PRIVATE CLIENT / WILLS / ESTATE ADMINISTRATION

The High Court's recent decision in *Addison & Anor v Niaz* [2024] EWHC 3124 (Fam) has provided key insights into the requirements for responding to *Larke v Nugus* requests. A *Larke v Nugus* request is a formal request for a solicitor/legal professional to disclose information about the preparation of a Will, where the validity of that Will is disputed. who prepared a disputed will.

In *Addison & Anor v Niaz*, the children of the deceased suspected undue influence and a lack of testamentary capacity. They therefore issued a *Larke v Nugus* request to the solicitor who drafted the Will. The solicitor took four months to respond to the request, and provided only limited information when she did so. The children successfully applied to the Court to compel the solicitor to co-operate.

The court identified several issues in its judgment:

- Both delays and inadequacies in responding to the *Larke v Nugus* request.
- Inconsistencies between the solicitor's testimony and her own written evidence.
- The duty on legal professionals to respond promptly and thoroughly to *Larke v Nugus* requests.

The solicitor's failure to follow best practice led to a costs order against her. No regulatory action has yet been reported. This case is a stark reminder of the importance of prompt and appropriate responses to *Larke v Nugus* requests.

REVIEW SOLICITORS RESPOND TO SRA CALL FOR 'UNIVERSAL APPROACH' (advertisement)

On February 5th, 2025, the SRA published a study on consumer vulnerability in the legal market, conducted by Professor Harriet Pierpoint and Dr. Paolo Baffero at the University of South Wales. The research explored the possibility of developing a tool to measure consumer vulnerability, whilst acknowledging the challenge of defining and quantifying it. The study concluded that rather than focusing on individual adjustments, the legal sector should adopt a 'universal practice' approach to ensure accessibility and inclusivity. Paul Phillip, Chief Executive of the SRA, emphasised the need for accessible legal services to build trust and reduce complaints.

EMPLOYMENT LAW

After years of campaigning for change, Kent Law Society committee member Keeley Lengthorn received news on what would have been her son George's third birthday, that the government has added bereavement leave relating to miscarriage to its workers' rights reforms.

A proposed amendment to the Employment Rights Bill, which is currently going through the House of Commons, will allow two weeks leave for those who suffer a pregnancy loss before 24 weeks gestation. This entitlement would match the entitlement already in place for parents who suffer the loss of a pregnancy after 24 weeks.

Keeley and her fellow campaigners have worked tirelessly to bring about this change for parents who are grieving a loss in the earlier stages of pregnancy.

COUNCIL MEMBER'S REPORT

Two matters to report on for March:

1. Q1 Council Meeting on 19th March.
2. New guidance re TA6 forms, of particular relevance to Conveyancers.

Q1 Council Meeting, 19th March

Key points from the President’s report included:

1. In January the Ministry of Justice opened a consultation on increasing civil legal aid fees for those working in housing and immigration. The Society welcomed the proposal, which included an additional £20m a year for the civil legal aid sector as well as increased flexibility for civil legal aid providers, allowing greater freedom to choose how to deliver legal services to clients. While the increase in fees was promising, it must be followed up with further investment across all areas of civil legal aid such as assisting

victims of domestic abuse and providing advice to help people obtain the social care they need. The Society would continue to press for investment across all areas of civil legal aid.

2. The Society had also responded to the Independent Review of Criminal Courts, chaired by Sir Brian Leveson, and had made it clear that an additional court structure was not the answer to the backlog crisis. Many other steps should be taken, such as introducing a presumption that certain groups of offenders should be diverted from the criminal justice system by the police and Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) at the outset, where appropriate; better data sharing; more remote hearings at certain stages; and regular listings meetings. Upon announcement of the Review, the President was invited to meet with Sir Brian to discuss the issues being explored. He made the point to Sir Brian that the Review must aim for effective and fair justice – not just efficiency.
3. Sarah Sackman MP had recently been appointed Minister of State for Courts and Legal Services, and Lucy Rigby MP Solicitor General. As a solicitor herself, Lucy was a friend of the profession, and the Society looked forward to a positive working relationship with her and her team throughout her time in office.
4. The SRA was undertaking a public consultation on potential changes to how and when law firms handle client money and how this money is protected. The SRA has proposed moving away from client accounts to third-party managed accounts. We know that our members are strongly opposed to any changes to client accounts, which have been used for decades by law firms with millions of successful transactions conducted each year. Removing them may have huge ramifications for the quality of legal services including higher costs, delays and reduced access to justice. Instead we are urging the SRA to focus on improving its processes for identifying, monitoring and managing potential risks to consumers. We have also recommended that the SRA reintroduce mandatory annual accounts reports, strengthening of their authorisation process, and increasing their scrutiny of non-legal personnel.

TA6

On 19th March, Council discussed the future of the TA6 form. The following update from the Law Society will be of particular interest to Property lawyers.

Conveyancers are essential in the homebuying and selling process. Their trusted advice and expertise guide people through one of the most significant purchases of their lives. The Law Society values its conveyancing members and wants to make sure that we represent and advocate for you and provide transaction forms that help the conveyancing process run smoothly.

In 2024, the Law Society introduced the 5th Edition TA6 form to align with new guidance from the National Trading Standards Estate and Letting Agency Team (NTSELAT). While our intention

was to meet evolving regulatory, legal, and market demands, we acknowledge that we should have engaged with our conveyancing members much earlier in this process.

We're committed to doing better in the future, and that means involving our conveyancing members in the changes that impact them right from the start.

Listening to you: consultation and feedback

We paused mandatory use of the 5th Edition form for Conveyancing Quality Scheme (CQS) members and initiated a comprehensive consultation, independently led by 2CV Ltd. 1,200 solicitors, licensed conveyancers, estate agents, and sellers participated, offering rich and detailed feedback. Thank you to everyone who contributed — your input has been invaluable.

The consultation revealed the unique challenges conveyancers face, which vary widely depending on geography, career stage, and firm type. While the intention of the 5th Edition was to facilitate the provision of legal advice when sellers wanted to provide material information upfront, many conveyancers felt it did not fully achieve this goal.

A working group of residential conveyancers, from a variety of types of firms, and including the Vice President Mark Evans and three members of Council, has been meeting weekly for several months to analyse in depth the consultation responses and devise the new forms

Our solution: a new two-form approach

We are pleased to introduce a new two-form approach to TA6:

The TA6 6th Edition Form – this will become mandatory for CQS members from March 2026.

A Material Information (MI) Form (optional) – CQS members will not be required to use the optional MI Form.

This approach is informed by member feedback and aims to create a more straightforward process for conveyancers and their clients. The forms will:

- Be legally accurate
- Be easier to understand and navigate for both sellers and conveyancers
- Minimise duplication.

Based on member input, we are also improving sections of the form and providing:

- An extended implementation period to help members adapt to change
- Enhanced explanatory notes and focused training for conveyancers and clients
- User testing to ensure the forms are fit for purpose
- Clearer communication and training on future updates.
